**The CARE Project: Ensuring
Compassionate, Respectful and
Equitable Care for Birthing People**



In collaboration with the Ohio Department of Children and Youth and the Ohio Hospital Association, OPQC launched the Compassionate, Accountable, Respectful and Equitable (CARE) Care Project in fall 2023. This initiative aims to enhance equitable care for birthing individuals and their partners, aligning with the Health Equity Safety Standards set forth by the Joint Commission.

In its pilot phase, the CARE Project is actively engaging with 13 clinical teams in a Learning Community. These teams, from Ohio Equity Initiative communities, have engaged institutional and maternity care leadership and are focused on the following objectives:

- Ensuring collection of self-reported patient demographics.
- Using site-selected stratified maternity care data to guide improvement.
- Developing processes for patient and community feedback about maternity care experiences and co-produced action plans.
- Assessing and responding to patient health-related social needs.
